The main goal is **to promote the two projects** towards representatives of the European Institutions, Agencies and Regions, **making both the projects achievements and the results known at EU policy level.**

RAILHUC project (Railway Hub Cities and TEN-T network) has among its goals the analysis of interventions to maximise the efficient use of rail hubs in Central Europe and the planning of future actions for the integration of rail-hubs into TEN-T, regional and local transport systems, while **RAIL4SEE** project (Rail Hub Cities for South East Europe) aims at the identification of concrete actions to increase the efficiency of rail services in South-East Europe, both by enhancing the ability to generate policies and investments, and by favouring the implementation of live pilot tests.
